Some arguments we can use to convince others about the truth of the resurrection \dots


- 1. Where else in ancient history do we find as many as <u>four relatively uneducated</u> authors giving contemporary accounts of the same miraculous events?
- 2. Where else do we find such a <u>wealth of ancient manuscripts</u> all pertaining to one set of events (24,300 manuscripts for the Gospels compare with 10 for Caesar's Gallic Wars).
- 3. Where else in ancient history do we find such <u>a short interval between time of writing and the date of the oldest extant manuscript?</u> (Compare 45 years for John's Gospel written about 90 A.D. with the oldest fragment, the Rylands Papyrus 152 dated to *circa* 125 A.D. with 900 years for Tacitus's Annals.)
- 4. Even non-Christians testify that Jesus performed marvellous works: Flavius Josephus, the Jewish Historian records in 93-94 A.D.: "About this time there lived Jesus, a wise man. For he was one who wrought surprising feats and was a teacher of such people who accept the truth gladly ... When Pilate, upon hearing him accused by men of the highest standing among us, had condemned him to be crucified, those who had in the first place come to love him did not give up their affection for him. (*Antiquities of the Jews*, book 18, Ch.3, 3.)
- 5. Nothing else explains the sudden spread of Christianity and the willingness of the Apostles and early disciples to die rather than give up their faith in Him.

Thomas replied, 'My Lord and my God!'

Jesus said to him:
